ADMINISTRATION

EDI: Diversity audits continue in the collections of youth services and bookmobile. Period Awareness Month kits are being planned with a staff collection; additional PPE kits were distributed to underserved communities. Staff has undergone collection development training. We are looking at inclusive hiring practices and increased accessibility through ASL, closed captioning, and español, among others. Coming soon: For AAPI month in May, the solidarity statement will be posted and extensive library resources highlighted online and in the library. A Native American culture program will be presented in July.

Friends: BookEnds volunteers will be allowed back in the building starting Monday, May 17. There are no plans to reopen BookEnds at this time, but the Friends are preparing for when it is deemed safe and appropriate to reopen again.
