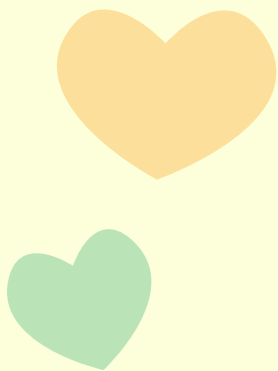

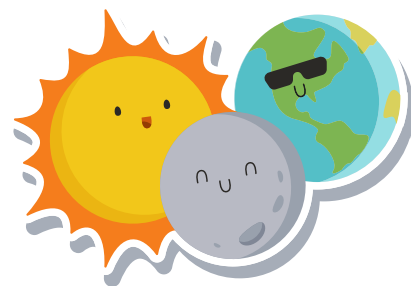

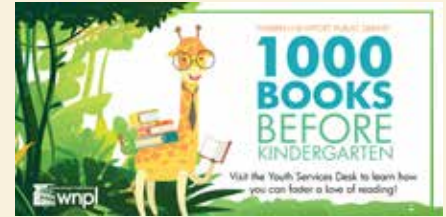

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

- 1000 Books Before Kindergarten is a library program that encourages all families to read with their young children before they enter kindergarten. The program is open to preschool-age children with their families and caregivers.
- To participate, register your child on Beanstack. (If you need help, just ask!) Log the books you read with your child. Books read at school or in storytime count as well, and the same book titles can be logged multiple times. Receive a reward every time you read 100 books. Keep reading and keep logging until you reach 1000! All it takes is just one book per day.
