

Over the first half of 2025, you'll see ongoing changes, including new furniture and a redesigned layout. We are creating distinct "neighborhoods" within the library, organized by how our patrons use the space, and focusing on merchandising our collections for easier browsing. These improvements will create a more enjoyable browsing experience, a comfortable café area, versatile study spaces, and updated furniture throughout the building.
